#### Artists Working in Education

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**Position 1** (4 available) **AWE Truck Studio Intern:** Join AWE's Truck Studio team in developing project-based learning curriculum for early learners and community-based programs. Learn about art education best practices and lesson planning while designing and assembling kits and projects for youth in Milwaukee.

**Position 2** (1 available) **AWE Office Intern:** Get a behind-the-scenes look at AWE's impact by diving into the data. The AWE Office Intern will compile and analyze new and historic data to provide overviews of program results and impact.

## Lynden Sculpture Garden

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(2 available) **Art Education Intern:** The Lynden Sculpture Garden operates as a laboratory that creates, supports, and shares experiences at the intersection of art, nature, and culture. In response to the covid-19 crisis, Lynden will offer two-week blocks of thematic programming from mid-July to the end of August. In each of these blocks there will be up to 10 standalone, one-day outdoor workshops, each serving one of four age groups: 1-3 (with parent); 4-6 (with parent); 7-11; and 10-15. Workshop length will vary with age: 1 hour to 90 minutes for the younger groups, and 3 hours for the two older groups. All groups will be limited to 10, including Lynden staff and any parents participating alongside their children. Workshops will be designed to offer meaningful experiences while following the guidelines set by the CDC, local state and county regulations. The art education intern will assist in the operation of all workshop activities including regular set-up, clean-up and disinfecting of program materials, and the supervision of children aged 1 to 15 years to maintain social distancing while in programs. Weekly hours will follow the workshops series with some variations; generally, three days per week for 5 hours each day (June 15th- August 14th) with 22 hours attending trainings and onsite preparation of materials leading up to the opening of the series.
