(2 available) **Workshop and Production Assistant:** Bembé Drum & Dance workshop and production assistants will help support Bembé's in-person summer programming, including Afro-Latino drum and dance workshops for youth and teens ages 6-13, student performances, and community events. They will also explore production through their creation and support of an educational, cultural arts production, including assisting with casting, staging, set and costume design, as well as event promotion and management. (2 available) **Art Education Intern:** The Lynden Sculpture Garden operates as a laboratory that creates, supports, and shares experiences at the intersection of art, nature, and culture. Lynden's summer camps integrate our collection of monumental outdoor sculptures and temporary installations with the natural ecology of 40 acres of park, ponds, and woodland, creating a unique hands-on experience of art in nature.
