Position Title: Creative Career Summer Intern (8 positions available)

Job Description: Art Start Creative Career Interns will support the design, development, and execution of Art Start's summer projects, specifically, the coordination, curation, installation, and activation of Art Start's inaugural youth-curated group art show and The Artist Statement public campaign.

Art Start summer interns will use art to explore, envision, and portray the complex narratives of their identities by reworking their personal narratives and developing their artist portfolio and statement through multidisciplinary creative sessions, including professional photoshoots; storytelling; oral history and motivational interviews; creative writing, poetry, and monologues; music; film; and visual art modalities.

The exhibitions will respectively premiere and activate at Art Start Studio for Milwaukee's Summer and Fall 2026 Gallery Night MKE in the Third Ward. Interns will also develop their creative process portfolio/lookbook, business cards, and resumes, participate in special networking opportunities, and participate in a tentative, merit-based day trip to Madison, WI or Chicago, IL, hosted by Art Start board members and industry partners, such as Shake Shack, Dr.Jart+, LinkedIn, Hearst Media Company, Sotheby's, and Cadogen Tate. Interns will also have access to college readiness with Art Start's Academic Advisor and youth mental health resources and interventions, under the guidance of Art Start staff and licensed social workers specializing in teen and young adult education and workforce development.
