## Introduction and Program Description

Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) has partnered with the Wisconsin Evaluation Collaborative (WEC), a unit within the Wisconsin Center of Education Research (WCER) at UW-Madison, to conduct independent, third-party evaluations of the district's 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Learning Center (CLC) program since 2014-15. This report specifically addresses the district's CLC program from the 2021-22 school year, during which MPS (through Milwaukee Recreation) operated 35 CLC sites located across the city and operated by five lead agencies as described below.

The CLC mission and program description (from the program website; see <a href="https://milwaukeerecreation.net/rec/Programs/Summer/Community-Learning-Centers.htm">https://milwaukeerecreation.net/rec/Programs/Summer/Community-Learning-Centers.htm</a>), is as follows:

In partnership with local youth-serving and neighborhood agencies, CLCs promote increased student achievement and learning by offering engaging academic enrichment activities. CLCs are also safe, fun places for youth to learn and play throughout the year. The program provides positive after-school alternatives and serves as a safe haven.

CLC sites offer a range of educational, recreational, and social activities for youth and adults including:

- Academic Enrichment Activities
- Youth Development Activities
- College and Career Readiness
- Social and Emotional Learning
- Technology Education
- Arts
- Recreation Activities
- Family Engagement Activities

CLC programming is supported by grants from the U.S. Department of Education administered through the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI). While CLC programs may charge nominal fees for students and families, ability to pay is not a barrier to program participation.

The 2021-22 school year marked a "return to normal" for MPS operations in general and for CLC programming specifically, with most restrictions that had been in place during the COVID-19 pandemic lifted. Most notably, all MPS schools and students returned to in-person instruction at the beginning of the 2021-22 school year, and restrictions on CLC attendance that had been in place during the last part of the 2019-20 school year (and the entire 2020-21 school year) were lifted.

At the same time, it would be misleading to imply that 2021-22 was business as usual in other ways, including (but not limited to) student attendance, behavior, engagement/focus, and overall mental health, as well as CLC staffing. Student day-school attendance in 2021-22 was substantially lower than pre-pandemic levels, for example, and this translated to lower CLC attendance as well. Behavioral issues among some students were another challenge, particularly (as reported by both day-school and CLC staff) among younger students who in many cases had limited interaction with peers, grew unfamiliar with the rules and routines of school, and spent a lot of time watching TV or on their phones. Not surprisingly, some students struggled to re-learn the rules and routines of school, and had limited ability to focus over the course of long school days. School staff also reported that many students struggled

with overall mental health, as did families (which were less likely to attend CLC events compared to prepandemic days). From a staffing perspective, CLC lead agency staff reported substantial issues during the 2021-22 school year as well, as staff who were laid off due to pandemic-related attendance restrictions found other jobs, making it difficult to fully staff CLC sites. These and other related themes are found throughout this report, supporting an overall conclusion that the 2021-22 school year was both a welcome return to some degree of pre-pandemic stability as well as a year of considerable challenges.

#### Methodology

Similar to previous years, the 2021-22 CLC evaluation report follows guidelines set by DPI for CLC grantees statewide, including data reported both districtwide and at an individual site level on numbers of students served, how often students attend CLC, selected student demographics, and progress toward the four state CLC goals (see description below). To conduct the evaluation, WEC requested and received the data elements listed below from MPS, although we note that some types of MPS and CLC data (such as disciplinary records) from the 2021-22 school year were not directly comparable to prepandemic years.

- CLC attendance and participation in selected types of CLC activities
- Student demographics
- School attendance (from students' MPS day school)
- Disciplinary records (from students' MPS day school)
- Assessment results
- CLC surveys of students, families, and teachers
- CLC site-level goal attainment

As relates to CLC goal attainment, individual CLC sites in MPS generally establish between one and four local goals for each of the four state goals, as described below. Not all sites are required to establish local goals for each state goal, depending on their CLC funding cycle. More information on CLC goal attainment for the district and for individual sites is presented below.

## **Evaluation Findings**

The first section of this report summarizes key components of the MPS CLC initiative, in accordance with the Local Evaluation Report Guidelines issued by DPI.<sup>1</sup>

#### Students Served and Attendance

The 35 MPS CLC sites in operation during the 2021-22 school year served a total of 2857 students who attended one or more days (Table 1), representing an increase of nearly 60% from the prior year (2020-21) when CLC attendance was substantially impacted by the COVID pandemic. Students attended an average of 67.0 days in 2021-22, and sites served an average of 82 students. Table 1 also provides a breakdown of attendance for MPS CLC sites in 2020-21 (prior year) and 2021-22 (current year) using the categories recommended by DPI. In 2021-22, the largest share of students (37.3%) attended MPS CLC sites more than 90 days, which represents a substantial increase from 2020-21. MPS continues to operate the largest CLC program in Wisconsin, as evidenced by the fact that the 2857 students attending

MPS CLC sites in 2021-22 represented around 20% of the approximately 14,000 total students served by all CLC sites statewide.

#### Student Demographics

Selected characteristics of CLC attendees in MPS during 2021-22 are shown in Table 2 below, including the number at each grade level and subgroup that attended CLC at all, at least 30 days, and at least 90 days. Similar to prior years, the largest number of attendees by grade level were in grades 1-5, and younger students (grades K5-5) had higher shares of students attending both 30+ and 90+ days of CLC.

MPS CLC participation and attendance by grade level and by subgroup (including gender, race/ethnicity, Special Education status, English Learner status, and participation in the free/reduced price lunch program) are shown in Table 2. African American and Hispanic students comprised a slightly larger share of those with any CLC attendance compared to MPS overall enrollment, as did English Learner students and those from lower-income families.

#### **Program Operation**

Hours of operation for each CLC site in 2021-22 are shown in the site-level summaries below. All 35 sites were open in 2021-22 after school for approximately 10-18 hours each week, and four sites were also open in the morning before school (for an additional 3-9 hours each week). MPS schools operated on different calendars in 2021-22 (with some starting in August and others starting in September), but all CLC sites were generally open whenever MPS was in session (approximately 37 weeks).

#### Progress toward Objectives

DPI has established four goals for all CLC sites statewide:

- State Goal 1: Provide a stable, safe, and supportive environment to meet the needs of the target population
- State Goal 2: Challenge youth as learners
- State Goal 3: Support the development of other skills necessary for student success
- State Goal 4: Engage families in support of student learning

MPS CLC sites are generally required to develop at least one local goal that corresponds to each of the four statewide goals, although (as noted previously) some MPS sites are not required to develop local goals for each state goal based on when their CLC funding cycle began.

Table 3 below shows the number of 2021-22 local goals set collectively by all MPS CLC sites for each of the four state goals, along with (a) the number of local goals for which sufficient data exist to measure goal attainment; and (b) the number and percentage of local goals met collectively by MPS CLC sites. In

the case of State Goal 4, we note that CLC family engagement was impacted in 2021-22 (as in prior years) by many sites setting local goals around attendance at family nights - which has proven difficult to track down from individual sites and/or challenging in terms of being able to accurately match family members with students.

With these caveats in mind, we note that 58 of the 107 local goals set by MPS CLC sites in 2021-22 for which sufficient data exist to measure progress were met, for an overall goal attainment rate of 54%. This represents improvement from 2020-21, where the overall local goal attainment rate for MPS CLC sites was 40%, although we note that goal attainment in 2020-21 was enormously impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and should be considered with that caveat in mind. The highest share of 2021-22 local goals was met under State Goal 1, which most sites measured through student CLC attendance, survey results, and day school behavior, while a lower share of local goals was attained under State Goals 2 and 3.

As noted above, local goals set under State Goal 4 (involving family engagement) have in general been more difficult to measure, given that many sites set their goals around attendance at family night events. These events have challenges associated with both data collection (accurately matching family members attending these events to their children) as well as the frequency of the events themselves (which in 2021-22 were generally not held as frequently, and/or weren't as well-attended, as was the case prior to the pandemic). Accordingly, it is not necessarily the case that MPS CLC sites are more effective with State Goal 1 compared to the other goals; instead, it may simply be the case that Goal 1 is easier to measure. Similarly, we anticipate that State Goal 4 will become easier to measure as CLC sites offer more family events and develop improved sign-in processes at these events to more accurately match family members to their children.

#### Conclusions and Recommendations

MPS's CLC program continued its mission of offering high-quality out-of-school opportunities to students during the 2021-22 school year. The district operated 35 CLC sites through Milwaukee Recreation that served nearly 3000 students (an average of 82 attendees per site) with 10-18 hours of afterschool programming each week. Students attended CLC an average of 67 days, with approximately two-thirds attending at least 30 days and more than one-third attending at least 90 days. CLC attendees were generally similar to MPS students overall in terms of key demographic characteristics such as family income, special education, and English Learner status.

In terms of local goal attainment, MPS CLC sites collectively met just over half (54%) of the local goals for which sufficient data could be obtained and analyzed. Rates of goal attainment varied considerably across the four state goals (with the highest share of local goals met under State Goal 1), although this may be at least partially attributable to ongoing challenges collecting high-quality data for other state goals (including State Goal 4 in particular).

A recommendation from prior years' reports that we reiterate here is for MPS to review and improve local goal-setting by reviewing the process by which individual CLC sites set their local goals, so that all local goals are rigorous (yet attainable) and have a clearly-defined data source. This may be particularly helpful in the case of State Goal 4, where sites in the past have often established local goals related to attendance at family nights that was tracked through paper sign-in sheets that did not always make clear associations between which family members were attending family nights with which students. Process improvements such as these will allow us to calculate goal attainment for a higher share of the local goals established by CLC sites in the future. We are pleased to report that MPS has taken an important step in this direction by requesting that WEC interview CLC site directors as part of the 2023-24 CLC evaluation report, to learn more about how local goals are set and (more importantly) how site directors think the goal-setting process can be improved. We have sent a summary of site directors' comments separately to MPS as part of our 2023-24 evaluation report, and will continue to work with the district to make local goals rigorous, meaningful, and well-measured.

The remainder of this report includes site-level data for each of the 35 MPS CLC sites that were in operation during the 2021-22 school year, presented in alphabetical order by site name. Data shown for each site include counts of student attendance by different attendance levels, selected demographics of CLC attendees, and local goal attainment under each of the four state CLC goals.
