

MPS Interscholastic Athletics Basketball Policies

- A School Administrator, Athletic Director and/or school safety officer must be on site for all home games and actively involved student/parent supervision.
- All ticket sales will be offered online only and are limited to 50 percent of seating capacity.
- Tickets sales to all basketball games (girls and boys) will end at 12 noon the day of the scheduled event.
- Ticket sales are limited to a per person/group max. Any increase in the number of tickets available per level will be determined at the discretion of the Commissioner of Athletics.
- Spectators and players are not allowed to activate, use, or display electronic communication devices other than cell phones for safety and transportation reasons.
- Admission to any game will be denied to those who have been transferred through the disciplinary process, currently suspended and/or at the direct request of school administration or at the discretion of the MPS Interscholastic Athletics office.
- Admission to any game will be denied to spectators deemed to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- Devices such as smoking vape pens, mace, pepper spray, and/or other weapons are strictly prohibited.
- Entry doors will be closed and locked 45 minutes after publicized game scheduled start time– no one will be admitted after that time.
- No refunds or exchanges are to be given for online ticket purchases unless otherwise stated in the online ticketing and refund policy.
- No outside food or drinks may be bought into the event including soda cans and bottles.
- All spectators may be required to show a government or school-issued ID to enter the game.
- Music (radio edit) must be limited to pre-game warm-ups and performance accompaniment.
- Hats may be worn, but must be straight forward. Wearing hoodie hoods or ski masks are not allowed.
- Cheerleaders may not cheer at away games. Must wear uniform for admission to home contests.
- Walk-through metal detectors and handheld scanners are to be used for all games.

Interscholastic Athletics Office will work with the Director of School Safety to provide Milwaukee Police Department and MPS School Safety personnel with a schedule of all games and request police presence for additional support of “high profile” games and other security reasons.
