YOUTH SPORTS SPECIATOR CODE OF CONDUCT

Effective immediately, the following spectator rules will be in effect at all Youth Sports programs:



Children under the age of 18 must be accompanied and supervised by a parent or legal guardian when attending a Youth Sports program.



Parents and spectators are **not allowed** on the **field of play**.



Hats may be worn, but must be **straight forward**. Wearing hoodies or ski-masks are not allowed.



Cowbells, air horns, vuvuzela horns, whistles and devices that simulate gunfire are not allowed (canons, cap pistols, etc.).



The **use of obscene language**, cheers, or remarks is **prohibited**.

Anyone who enters the playing surface area and/or disrupts game play will be asked to leave the facility immediately.

It is with extreme pleasure that we announce our 2024 Distinguished Alum Award recipient.

Manning Shareef, a junior at Milwaukee School of Languages, is on pace to graduate in 2025 as an accomplished trilingual scholar with 15 years in Spanish education. as well as another seven years in Japanese. Manning currently carries a 3.1 GPA. On the court, he has played varsity basketball since his freshman season, and averaged 25 points, 10 rebounds. and 3 assists per game during the 2023-24 regular season, highlighted by a Feb. 10 showing when he scored 40 points against the Juneau Pioneers, the eventual champions in the Milwaukee City Conference - Blue Division. After the season. he was named to the first team all-conference in the Blue Division.

Manning is also an employee for Milwaukee Recreation, refereeing at the elementary and middle school levels for the past year, ensuring the next generation of young people are learning



the game of basketball. He shows compassion for those around him and he volunteered recently at the Empty Bowls fundraiser, which raised over \$70K for the Friedens Food Pantries, a local food center network serving our community. He is also an active member of BLMA (Black and Latino Male Achievement) within Milwaukee Public Schools, where he strives to build the necessary skill set to navigate college, career, and life.

Congratulations to Darlene Gaspie and Emmitt McGee, our 2024 March of Champions Community Award winners! As South Division High School graduates, Darlene and Emmitt both have deep roots within Milwaukee Public Schools, and have continued to give back to our community with their nearly 90 years of combined service.

Darlene, nicknamed Dar, has spent over 50 years with Milwaukee Recreation, starting at 15 years old on the playground at Forest Home Playfield as a playleader and coach. Known for her passion for all sports, she has been a major presence at countless Milwaukee Recreation's youth sports events, working as a league director and official for volleyball, basketball, and softball.

Emmitt, known throughout the city as Mr. McGee, has worked with MPS for nearly four full decades. 



MORSE MIDDLE SCHOOL FOR THE GIFTED AND TALENTED





- Standard and current NFHS and WIAA Basketball rules and regulations will govern play.
- WIAA (where available) certified officials will be used for all rounds of tournament play.
- Only players listed on the regular season roster may participate in the tournament.
- Players must wear the same uniform number for the duration of the tournament.
- Every team MUST START the game with at least 4 players. They can finish with less, but must start with 4 players.
- Player playing time rules do not apply during March of Champions Basketball Tournamant games.
- Timing Regulations: The games consist of two 18-minute halves with a continuous clock. The Clock will only stop each time the whistle is blown by the official in the last two minutes of each half.
- 20 pt. "No Press" rule. Teams may begin to press again once the point differential has returned to 15 points or less. (Middle school)
- There will be a 20 pt. "mercy" continuous clock rule (second half).
- Elementry Press Line Rule utilized for the winter season, will still be enforced for the March of Champions Basketball Tournament (4th-5th Grade).
- On a team's first press line violation, a warning will be given. A team's second violation will result in a technical foul. Each team will be given one (1) warning per game. (Elem. ONLY)

- Press Line Rule is in effect until the last two minuites of the game (Elem. ONLY)
- Scoring: The score will not be displayed on the scoreboard after a team has a lead of thirty (30) points.
- Time Outs: 4 per game (Four = 60 Sec).
- •10 pt. "No Press" rule in the last 2 minuites of the game and overtime. (4th 5th Grade)
- Overtime: 3-minute period- If play exceeds 2 OT's it will result in "sudden death", this consists of a jump ball and the first to score wins.
- This only stands for the first three rounds of the tournament. In semi or final rounds 3-minutes overtime periods will continue.
- Clock will be stopped in the last two minutes of each overtime period.
- Full Court Press is allowed in all overtime periods (4th - 5th Grade).
- Each team will have one full time out per overtime period with no carry over.
- Technical Fouls: Automatic 2 points and team possession at half court.
- No Dunking: Dunking is prohibited during the March of Champion's Basketball Tournament. Dunking will result in a behavarioral technical foul
- 2nd Technical will result in ejection from the current game and the next game.
- WIAA bench technical rules apply to coaches (seatbelt).
